

David E. Harrell Scholarship
Offered by South East Metro Amateur Radio Club
(SEMARC)

Our club has established a \$1000 scholarship for 2022 in support of an area high school senior interested in amateur radio who will enroll as a full time student in any field of study in a two or four year technical school, college or university. The scholarship was founded in memory of club founder David E. Harrell who was instrumental in establishing the club as a non-profit organization in 1987. He also served as the club's first president.

The scholarship opportunity is being offered to seniors at Park, Woodbury, Hastings, Simley (Inver Grove Heights), So. St. Paul, East Ridge, New Life Academy, the Math and Science Academy, and any home schooled student that lives in these districts and would have attended one of these schools if not elected to be home schooled.

Basic Requirements

- A. Senior must be a licensed amateur radio operator of any class (Technician, General or Extra)
- B. Senior must have participated in amateur radio activities
- C. Senior must submit their latest GPA with application
- D. The selected candidate must show proof of full-time enrollment in a two- or four-year technical school, college or university before receiving scholarship funds.

Our club provides mentoring and testing for any student wishing to become licensed as an amateur radio operator. Contact the Scholarship Committee Chairman Dick Roberts at 651-769-0358 for information.

Scholarship applications are available from school counselors or can be downloaded from the semarc.org web site under "Special Projects". Applications must be turned in to counselors, or if home schooled mailed to the address on the application, by the first Monday in May. The awarding of the scholarship is at the sole discretion of the Scholarship Committee of the South East Metro Amateur Radio Club.
