This scholarship is being offered by the South East Metro Amateur Radio Club in support of a high school senior interested in amateur radio and a career path in a field of study at a two or four year technical school, college or university. You are asked to provide the information listed below as part of your application; if we do not have all this information as requested, we will not be able to process your application. This completed application must be turned into your high school counselor by the first Monday in May, in order to be considered. If applicant is being home school within a selected district the application must be submitted to the SEMARC Scholarship Committee at 1655 68th Street West, Inver Grove Heights, MN 55077-2222 within the same time frame. Basic Requirements:

Senior must be a licensed amateur radio operator of any class (Technician, General or Extra) Senior must have participated in amateur radio activities

Senior must submit his/her ACT or SAT score with application

Senior must submit his/her latest GPA with application

Candidates must attend an interview if requested to do so.

The selected candidate must provide proof of full-time enrollment in a two or four year technical school, college or university before receiving scholarship funds.

The final selection is at the sole discretion of the SEMARC scholarship committee.
